Thanks for having me. I think I've come to the right place—this is the acting club, not the science club, right? Great. Now I'm going to talk about how to do stand-up comedy.

The easiest way to get started is to write a script. Here are some tips. First, when you're writing, try to get personal. Include jokes that people can easily relate to. For example, you could talk about pets. Second, you need to build a story. This helps connect your jokes with each other. Third, use the news. News topics always sound fresh, so people won't hear the same jokes they've heard before.

Another technique is called "crowd work." Here's my advice. First, select the best people in the audience to talk to or make jokes with. For example, if you want to talk about relationships, find some couples in the audience. Then, make sure to ask open-ended questions so you can get an answer that is easy to make a joke about. Now, I'd like to play some of my shows from my YouTube channel. The first one is my favorite stand-up set. Take a look. (Feb. Unit 8)
