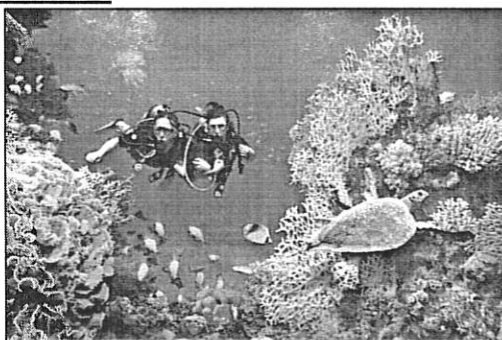

Thanks for coming to my talk on the impact of fast fashion. Fast fashion isn't free—we may pay low prices for clothes, but someone else is paying the cost instead. This "someone else" is often garment workers. They work unpaid overtime, often going 14 hours without a break.

In addition to the human cost, there's an environmental cost. Right now, 82 million tons of textiles are produced annually. Women today have four times as many clothing items as they did in the 1980s, and men have more, too. To make this many garments, we use 145 million tons of coal and two trillion tons of water. What's more, 1.5 million tons of clothing end up in landfills each year in the UK alone.

So how can we reduce the impact of fast fashion? For one thing, we can buy fewer clothes, or buy used clothes. For another, when buying clothes, make sure you put quality before quantity. You can also think about the materials of the clothes. Buy cotton rather than polyester, as it's better for the environment. Finally, you should repair damaged clothes if you can. Don't just throw them out! (Apr. Unit 14)
