*New fiction books may only be borrowed for 2 weeks.

◇ Borrowing Limits:

A maximum of 8 books & magazines at any one time.

For DVDs, a maximum of 3 items per member.

◇ Renewals:

Items may be renewed twice.

Renewals can be made online, by phone, or in person.

◇ Lost or Damaged Materials:

Members are responsible for the cost of replacement and a processing fee for lost or damaged items.

◇ Overdue Items:

Overdue fines are \$1 per item per day.

Borrowing privileges may be suspended for accounts with fines exceeding \$25.

◇ Returning Materials:

Items should be returned to the circulation desk or placed in the library's book drop.

W: What's the process if I've borrowed something and I want to renew the loan?


M: A loan on any item can be renewed twice. You can make renewals online, by phone, or in person.
