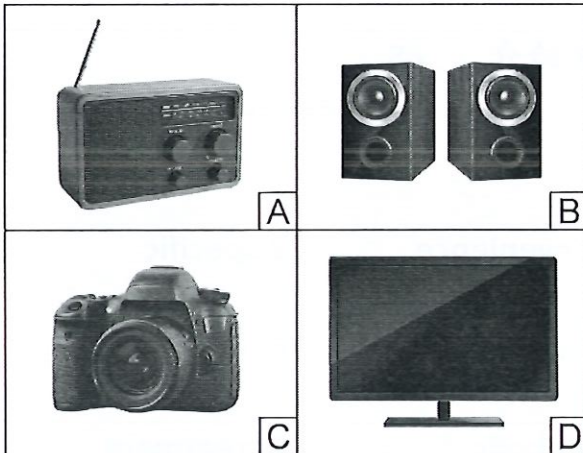

Around the world, some borders are difficult to understand on maps. Some areas belong to one nation but are located inside another country or far from their main country. Two important terms help explain these situations: "enclave" and "exclave." An enclave is a place completely surrounded by another country, like the hole in a doughnut. From the surrounding country's point of view, it's an enclave. An exclave is a part of a country that is separated from it by other land. It's like a puzzle piece that doesn't touch the main part. From the owning country's view, it's an exclave. There are also semi-enclaves and semi-exclaves. These touch

the sea but are still blocked by foreign land. These special borders show that country lines can be trickier than they seem. (Nov. Unit 4)
