Mark Twain was an American writer and humorist, born in 1835 in Missouri. His real name was Samuel Langhorne Clemens, and he is widely regarded as one of the greatest writers in American literature. Twain grew up along the Mississippi River, which later became an important setting in many of his stories. His experiences working on riverboats greatly influenced his writing style and themes.

Twain is best known for his sharp humor, social criticism, and realistic portrayal of American life. One of his most famous works is *The Adventures of Tom Sawyer*, which tells the story of a naughty boy growing up along the Mississippi River. It describes his adventures with friends, including playing games, exploring nature, and getting into trouble. Another major novel is *The Adventures of Huckleberry Finn*, often considered his masterpiece, which explores themes of freedom and friendship.

He also wrote *The Prince and the Pauper*, a story about two boys who switch identities and experience very different lives. Through these works, Twain used storytelling to highlight issues such as social inequality

Works	<i>The Adventures of Tom Sawyer</i> : A story about a boy growing up along the Mississippi River and his adventures with friends. <i>The Adventures of Huckleberry Finn</i> : Often considered his masterpiece, exploring themes of <u>freedom</u> and <u>friendship</u> . <i>The Prince and the Pauper</i> : A story about two boys who switch <u>identities</u> and live very different lives.
