I. Aim of the activity:

In celebration of the upcoming Christmas, I want my students to reflect on what is Christmas time to them except a time for reveling.

II. Film: A Christmas Carol



IV. Introduction about Charles Dickens

Charles Dickens (1812-70), English Victorian era author wrote numerous highly acclaimed novels including his most autobiographical David Copperfield. It had not been easy for Dickens to become the best-selling writer in English in his time. His childhood, like many of those portrayed in his novels, was not a happy one, owing to his father's inability to stay out of debt. When his father was sent to prison, Dickens was sent to work in a blacking warehouse. Memories of the time haunted him for the rest of his life. Dickens' early troubled have meant stories by a writer who really knew poor people and the difficulty of their lives. He understood them, and the books probably did more than anything else to make life better for them. During his lifetime Dickens became known the world over for his remarkable characters, his mastery of prose in the telling of their lives, and his depictions of the social classes, mores and values of his times. Some considered him the spokesman for the poor, for he definitely brought much awareness to their plight, the downtrodden and the have-nots.

V. Questions on the whole story:

Read the story and think hard about the questions before you answer them. Some of the questions ask for your opinion, and there is no fixed answer.

- 1. Which of the ghosts did the most to cause a change in Scrooge? Give a reason for your opinion.
- 2. Give one example of the way in which each of these people was kind:
 - a. Bob Cratchit
 - b. Marley's ghost
 - c. Scrooge's nephew Fred
 - d. Scrooge (in the end)
- 3. Find these words in the book, and then answer the questions that follow them.
 - a. "What reason have you to be merry? You're too poor to be

merry."

- 2. Who were the words spoken to?
- 3. What answer did the speaker get?
- 4. Can you give one reason why the person spoken to was "too poor"?
- b. "Prisons and workhouses can't really make people merry at Christmas time."

 - 3. Why did the speaker talk about prisons and workhouses?
 - 4. What happened when the two people met again?
- c. "I am wearing the chain that I made during my life."

VI. Students' reflections on the film
